Working With Others

Our Working With Others skills this term are, taking turns speaking/ listening and resolving conflicts (we are teaching them together as both are intrinsically interlinked). Teaching conflict resolution attempts to instil problem-solving skills amongst pupils who find themselves at odds. It involves allowing both children to express their points of view (through turn taking), interests, and provides ways to find acceptable solutions.

Children can find themselves in situations that lead to escalated conflict with other pupils in school. Often 'conflicts' can range from sharing a resource or toy, working with a particular pattern, standing first in the line or anything in between. As such conflicts arise in the classroom, lunchroom, library, playground, while standing in line, and any place where pupils gather together.

If you have time, please speak to your child about successful ways to resolve conflict and perhaps give example of how you resolve conflict yourself at work or in your day to day life.
