- Create a toy, from the 1940s, using only recycled materials
- Create your own model tank or gas mask
- How has fashion changed through the decades?
 Make a timeline to show typical clothes worn in each decade since the 1930's

Art

- Draw and label a plane or tank from WWII
- Create a collage of all the different things to do with WWII
- Design a safety poster telling people how to remain safe during a blackout (think about your own blackout experience)- use <u>ICT</u>

Maths

- Investigate the currency used during the 1940s. What did it look like?
- Research a WWII recipe and make it at home. Photograph the meal and write out the recipe OR create a video showing each step of the recipe. Write a review of the meal!
 - Remember to be careful when weighing and measuring ingredients
 - > Can you write down the measurements of each ingredient needed to feed 10 soldiers, 100 soldiers and 1500 soldiers?
- Create a graph comparing the size of armies from different nations

<u>English</u>

- Make a word-search containing places, names and words connecting to WWII
- Make up a quiz using facts about WWII
- Write a poem about the Blitz. Challenge: can you use similes and alliteration?
- Imagine you are an evacuee. Write your first letter home explaining your feelings about your situation
- Write instructions for citizens to follow during an air raid

- Research what school life was like for children during WWII
